- Language Requirement: _____
Students must complete six hours of advanced 3000- or 4000-level work in French, German or Spanish. Less commonly taught languages such as Portuguese or Italian may be used, subject to the availability of courses. Three to six hours in an approved study abroad program in Europe may substitute for all or part of this requirement. For native speakers of a European language other than English, this requirement is waived.

Electives – minimum of 18 hrs:

**NOTE: a maximum of nine hours may be submitted from any one department; and a maximum of six hours may be submitted from courses taken in the student's major department.
